

November 2012 update

The SBC has been busy offering tours to community members, which will continue as the project progresses. The one-hour tour includes a walk-through of the cafeteria, auditorium, gymnasium, library, offices, and classrooms. Signups were most recently held at the "State of the Schools" event on October 25.

Impressive red brick designs, trim that looks more like expensive stone, and overall attention to detail are the hallmarks of this project. "Ground faced blocks" are used for the lower sections of inside walls. Molded trim and pilasters are made from artificial stone. Interior trim is natural red oak with a clear finish. All these materials offer an attractive finish that is lower in cost and will require less maintenance. Painted walls are generally confined to high areas, inaccessible to students walking through the corridors, again reducing maintenance. Currently, the remainder of the windows are being installed so the building can be "buttoned up" for the winter, which will allow the inside work to continue unimpeded by cold weather.

At the October meeting, the SBC reviewed the color choices for the inside walls and floors. It will come as no surprise that shades of blue and gold will be seen throughout the building, with other colors used more sparingly. The final color palettes were displayed at the State of the Schools event.
